# 1995

The FDA approves tramadol under the name "Ultram" as a non-controlled painkiller, but warns about abuse potential. 1,3



1996

Cases of tramadol abuse are noted and the FDA revises the product label to include warnings about the potential for abuse.<sup>6</sup>


